Purpose of this dashboard

This dashboard draws together a range of performance indicators into a concise, graphical report. It compares London performance and England, and shows trends over time. It can be used to:

- identify relative strengths and weaknesses in performance
- plan and commission services
- inform self-evaluation and set targets
- demonstrate impact and effectiveness

How to interpret the analysis

Each indicator on the dashboard has:

- a trend line to show London's change over time for up to four years (subject to availability of the data)
- a rank of London against the other 8 regions.

Performance indicators

Performance indicators are those that allow the measurement of "better" or "worse" performance. Note that for some performance indicators better performance means a higher percentage (e.g. achievement of attainment thresholds), while in other cases lower means better (e.g. absence rates).

Trend lines show the best year's performance with a green dot and the worst year's performance with a red dot

The best performing region has a rank of 1st and the lowest nationally is ranked 9th

Volume & incidence indicators

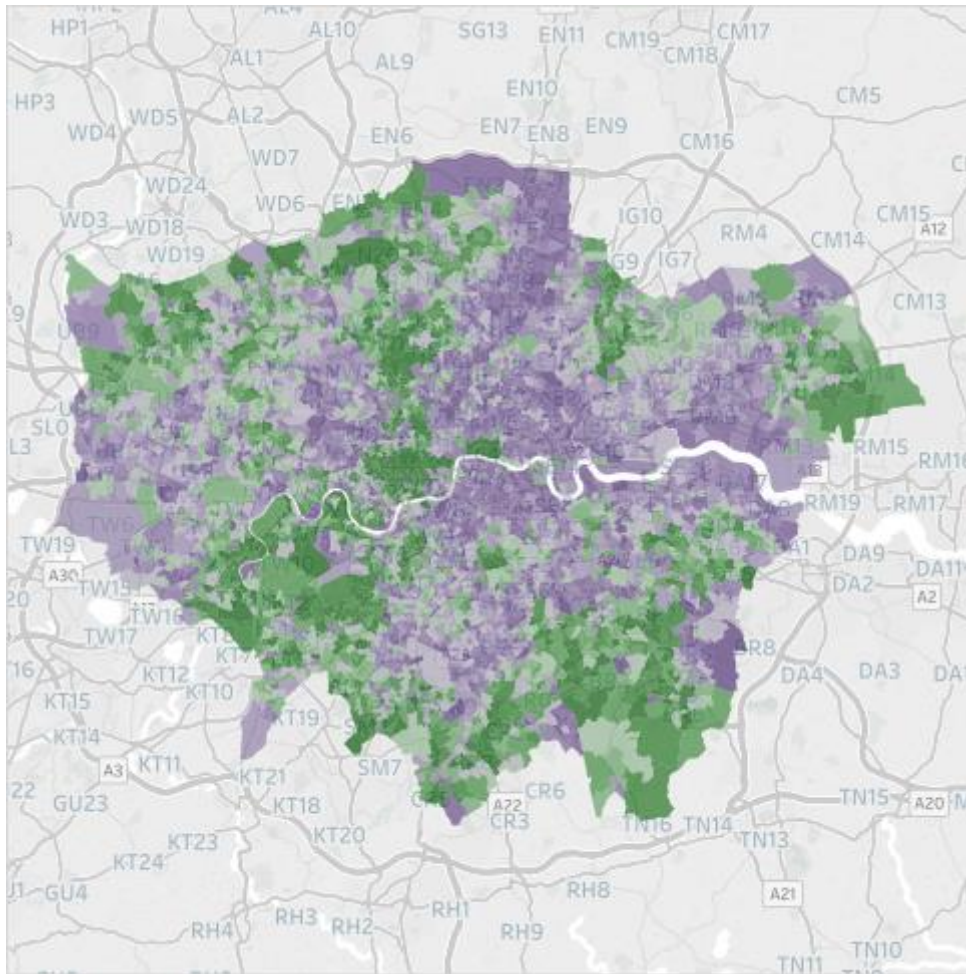
Volume & incidence indicators have no "better" or "worse" performance, just more or less of something.

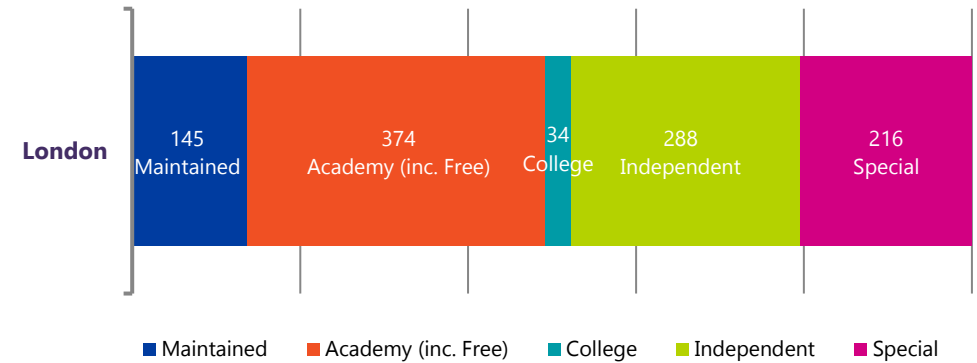
Income Deprivation Affecting Children (IDACI) Map



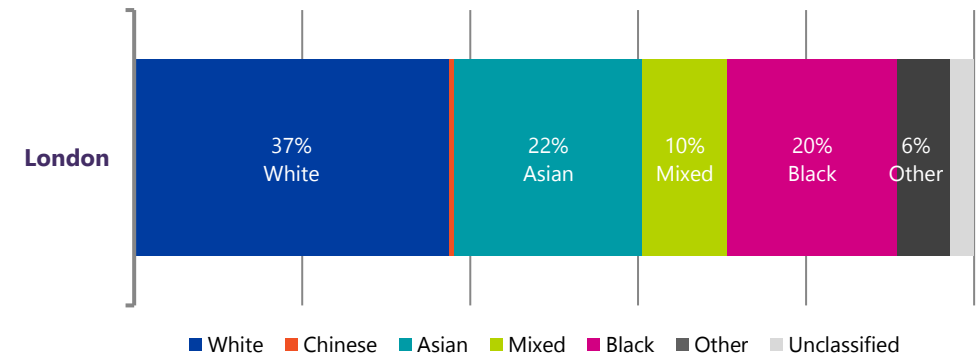
Deprivation ranks are based on the 2019 Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index (IDACI). This ranks each LSOA (an area of about 1000 households) in order of the 32,844 LSOAs nationally. LSOAs are grouped into 10 coloured bands, where the darkest purple is an LSOA in the 10% most deprived nationally, and darkest green is in the 10% least deprived nationally.

KS5 - Key Stage 5

FSM - Free School Meals

LA - Local Authority

APS - Average Point Score

IDACI - Income Deprivation Affecting Children Index

LSOA - Lower Super Output Area. An area with population of approximately 1500 used in Census and other datasets.

NEET - Not in Education, Employment or Training.

Level 2 - Attainment of Level 2 equates to achievement of 5 or more GCSEs at grades A*-C or equivalent qualifications.

Level 3 - Level 3 equates to achievement of 2 or more A-levels or equivalent qualifications.

Including Ox. and Cam. - Including students at the University of Oxford and the University of Cambridge.

Mainstream - Not including Independent schools.
